
Gia Prima Studio Theater

Counselor's Corner

"The School Counselors, in collaboration with the Ocean County College Department of Academic Success, met with juniors this week to evaluate their individual progression toward attaining the Associates Degree. In the coming weeks, we will plan to meet with sophomores who are also planning to complete the program requirements in their PAA major for the Associates Degree to help determine the specific credits they need to earn to meet that goal.

It is extremely important that OCC Early College students access the <u>Welcome Letter</u> they received upon registering for their first OCC course which included their OCC Student ID#. Getting familiar with the Ocean Connect account enables students/parents to view their OCC transcript, view and pay their bill as well as many other informational topics."

From Mrs. Shoenberger for Science!

For the scientific method unit in biology, Miss Shoenberger's students have been designing their own inquiry investigations on mealworm behaviors. The first step of the scientific method is to carefully observe and pose a question. To conquer this step, the students first observed the mealworms and performed measurements on them using stereoscopes, followed by additional background research. They were all amazed to discover that mealworms are actually beetle larvae that can be found across the world infesting stores of grains and even supplies of dog and cat food. They've even been found infesting styrofoam warehouses. However, these mealworms are not just pests, but rather serve as an important part of the food chain since they are preyed upon by birds, reptiles, and even humans in some parts of the world! From here, the students collaborated with their group members to pose their own questions that can be answered through a controlled experimental set-up. One group of students will be investigating if mealworms prefer damp or dry, warm or cold oatmeal, while another group is investigating whether the mealworms prefer Styrofoam, dog food, cat food, or oatmeal. The groups are working diligently on designing their own procedures and data tables so that they can draw conclusions and share their findings with other student scientists. What claims will they be able to make? What explanations will they pose for their findings?? Stay tuned for April's newsletter!
